ART IN THE SUMMER

JOIN US AT THE DE YOUNG EACH WEEK FOR OUR FIVE-DAY (MONDAY TO FRIDAY) MUSEUM ART CAMP FOR CHILDREN ENTERING KINDERGARTEN TO ENTERING FIFTH GRADE.

Classes include explorations of the museum's galleries, adventures in Golden Gate Park, visual and performing art activities, and instruction by professional teaching artists. Classes take place in the de Young galleries, the Tower studio classrooms, and selected sites in Golden Gate Park. Morning classes are from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., and afternoon classes are from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. A supervised lunch period and outing from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. is provided for campers enrolled in both morning and afternoon sessions. Children may enroll for half-day camps from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Campers must bring their own lunch. An optional Open Studio from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. allows for less-structured time in the studio classrooms. Parents may arrive anytime within the Open Studio time period for pick-up.

Refunds

All refund requests must be made in writing two weeks prior to the first class meeting. Fifteen percent of the class fee is retained by FAMSF. If FAMSF cancels a class due to insufficient enrollment, the entire class fee will be refunded. A \$25 non-refundable processing fee applies to each change made to a camper's schedule.

WEEKLY THEMES

- #### 1 Drawn to Drawing

June 21–25
Students will learn the fundamentals of drawing and will experiment with a variety of materials, including pencils, charcoals, and oil pastels.
- #### 2 Sculpture through Time

June 28–July 2
Inspired by the sculptures in the de Young's Sculpture Garden as well as the collection of African, Oceanic, and Mesoamerican art, students will experiment with a variety of materials to build their own works of art.
- #### 3 Exploring California

July 12–16
Explore the Golden State by looking at its art, architecture, and landscapes. We will make sculpture, go on adventures in Golden Gate Park, and meet a local artist (or two!). This week will include a visit to the Strybing Arboretum.
- #### 4 Mix It Up!

July 19–23
Young artists will try different media and techniques while learning about color, shading, composition, and perspective.



- #### 5 Voyage to the Americas

July 26–30
There's more to the Americas than just the United States. We'll explore both continents and see how their geography and history influence the art. We will be working with a variety of media to create some of our own American art.
- #### 6 The Power of Painting

August 2–6
There are so many styles of painting; each makes us respond in a different way. We will be looking at and talking about what we see in the galleries, getting inspired, then returning to the studio to paint, paint, paint! This week will include a visit to the Conservatory of Flowers.
- #### 7 Animals in Art

August 9–13
Explore the world of animals in art! Draw, paint, and build animals using a variety of materials. Our adventures will take us outside to Golden Gate Park.
